New Lighting: The Parish Finance and Fabric Committee have proposed that we install new LED light fittings in the Sanctuary area and the transept chapel areas as well as some roof lighting. The project has been approved by the Diocesan Board of Administration and is currently being considered by the North West Historic churches Committee. This will greatly enhance the visual aspect of the Church and architectural areas of the Church. It is a major financial commitment but we believe it will provide value for money in the long term as well as being in keeping with Pope Francis’ call to protect the environment; modern lighting will consume much less energy. The work will take several weeks and will cause some inconvenience, but we will keep you informed as and when this is likely to happen.
